

Faux shutter card (also called Fractured card)

You will need:

- Card base – 21 x 14.85cm Real Red cardstock, scored at 10.5cm
- DSP from Joy of Christmas DSP pack – 10 x 14.35cm
- 2 strips Real Red cardstock – 0.5 x 14.5cm
- 2 strip Real Red cardstock – 0.5 x 10cm
- 1 Basic White cardstock piece diecut using middle square die (~5cm)
- 1 Basic White cardstock piece die cut using smallest tree die from Merriest Trees dies
- 1 3-dot and 1 6-dot piece die cut from Real Red (adhesive sheeting on back) from Merriest Trees dies
- 1 DSP strip – 0.5 x 10cm



1. Use the template to adhere your white square die cut into the correct position on the DSP by lining up the edges on all sides (you don't really need a template but I thought this would make it easier to line it up straight).
2. Adhere one of the shorter Real Red strips along one side of the square with the end level with the end of the square and the rest hanging off the DSP (see Fig 1)



3. Adhere one of the longer Real Red strips next to the square, putting one end against the first strip (see Fig 2).
4. Repeat with the short strip then the long strip to complete the square.
5. Turn the DSP over and trim off the excess pieces.
6. Adhere the DSP to the card base.

7. Stamp the tree die cut using Garden Green ink on the solid stamp, and the Shaded Spruce ink for the texture stamp.
8. Add the 3-dot piece to the top section of the tree and the 6-dot piece to the bottom section.
9. Add three rhinestones to the tree and a yellow gem from the Tinsels gems 4 pack to the top of the tree.
10. Stamp the tree trunk near the bottom of the white square using the Pebbled Path ink.
11. Adhere the tree into place using dimensionals.
12. Stamp the sentiment in the middle of the white cardstock mat using Garden Green ink
13. Adhere the thin strip of DSP across the bottom leaving a slight gap
14. Attach the white mat to the inside of the card base.
